He closed the door.
- 2 With verbs ending in a short vowel and one consonant, double the consonant and add -ed.
*I stop**ped** the car.*
- 3 With verbs ending in -y after a consonant, remove -y and add -ied.
He married the President's daughter.

BUT

She played tennis yesterday.

Note these pronunciation rules:

- 1 When the base form ends in -d or -t, we pronounce -ed as /ɪd/.
- 2 When the base form ends in -p, -k, -f, -sh, -ch, we pronounce -ed as /t/.
