**Blending Families: Advice for Stepparents** 

Blended families, or stepfamilies, are now very common. In the U.S., at least one-third of all children will be part of a blended family before they reach the age of eighteen. At first, the changes for children in blended families may be difficult. But most blended families are able to work out their problems and live together happily.

#### What is a blended family?

In a blended family, one or both parents have children from earlier relationships. The parents may be divorced or widowed. When they decide to get married again, they bring children from their first marriage to live with their new husband or wife and, in some cases, his or her children.

#### What can new stepparents do?

While the new marriage is exciting for the parents, the children may be worried. Will they have a good relationship with their new stepfather or stepmother? What will their new stepbrothers and stepsisters be like?

A few important things for new stepparents to remember are:

- Be realistic: Everything won't be perfect in the beginning.
- Be patient: Good relationships take time.
- Don't expect too much: Give your stepchildren your time, energy, and love, but don't expect anything in return for now.

The good news is that, with good communication and a lot of support, kids usually adjust to their new family members. The bad news? Creating a healthy blended family takes hard work and a lot of time.

#### Presenting the Sony, er . . . Stowaway?

r. Akio Morita and Mr. Masaru Ibuka started the Sony Corporation in Tokyo in 1946. At first, Sony was a small electrical repair company. In 1953, they started to sell the first transistor radios. In 1979, Sony introduced one of their most famous products, the "Walkman" portable cassette player.

Sony engineers invented the Walkman after they noticed young Japanese people listening to music all day, even carrying large stereos to the park. They believed that people wanted a music player that was small enough to wear in a shirt pocket. Sony also wanted the cassette player to be easy to use, so that people could listen to music while doing other things like exercising, riding the train, or doing housework.

Sony chose the name "Walkman" for their new product. At first, the Walkman didn't sell well. Electronic stores didn't think people would buy it. Some thought that the Walkman would make people unfriendly and stop talking to other people. However, as more people heard about the Walkman, it became a big hit. Japanese music fans loved it. When Sony was ready to sell the Walkman in other countries, they worried that people would think that the name was bad English. They made plans to call it the "Soundabout" in the United States and

the "Stowaway" in the United Kingdom. But Mr. Morita wanted his gadget to have the same name in every country, and now "Walkman" is its name all over the world. You can even find "walkman" in the dictionary! Since 1979, there have been 300 different Walkman models and over 150 million have been sold around the world. Today's Walkman is a video MP3 player with built-in wireless Internet. The Sony Walkman is the best selling consumer electronic product ever made.

Bargaining Customs around the World

Bargaining customs are very different around the world. Few would go shopping in another country without knowing the exchange rate. However, many travelers don't learn anything about the local shopping customs of the place they are visiting before spending money. Understanding when it's OK to bargain can save you a lot of money and make your shopping experience much more enjoyable.

In some countries, bargaining is an important part of the shopping culture. In others, bargaining is not done at all. Here's a bargaining guide for some countries around the world:

**Morocco:** Bargaining is always expected in the shopping markets. Here bargaining is more than just getting the best price. If you go into a shop and agree to the first price a seller offers, the seller may not be happy. For Moroccans, bargaining is a form of entertainment; it's a game of skill, a little bit of acting, and it's a chance to chat about the weather, business, and family. So be sure to have fun and try to get a better price!



**Switzerland:** Bargaining is not the custom here. Shop clerks can almost never give you a lower price. However, some hotels may give you a lower rate during the less popular times of year. It can't hurt to ask.

**Tahiti:** Bargaining is not appropriate in the South Pacific. In fact, it is considered disrespectful to ask for a better price. In the food markets, sellers will even take their fruits and vegetables back home with them, rather than give a discount!



# What continent is home to the world's biggest shopping malls?

It's not North America. Only one of the world's ten largest malls is in the U.S. Built in 1969, the Eastwood Mall Complex in Youngstown, Ohio, is the ninth largest mall. Similarly, one Canadian mall made the top-ten list. The West Edmonton Mall in Alberta, built in 1981, is number six.

Europe's biggest mall—fifth on the list of the world's largest—is newer. It was built in 2005. It's located in Istanbul, Turkey.



The continent with the biggest, newest, and most exciting malls is Asia. Seven of the world's ten largest shopping malls are in Asia. The two largest are in China and opened in 2005 and 2004. The New South China Mall in Dongguan has 1500 stores and 7.1 million square feet of retail space. The Golden Resources Mall in Beijing—also called "The Great Mall of China"—has 50,000 visitors every day. Enormous malls in the Philippines, Dubai, and Malaysia have roller coasters, ice-skating rinks, water parks, aquariums, and bowling alleys.
